

“Big Cranes, Bigger Deal” – February 2, 2007

The following is a reply submitted for consideration in the Opinions section of the *Star-News*.

Like many local residents, I have noted with some interest and anticipation the upcoming arrival of the four (4) new cargo cranes being delivered to the State Port in Wilmington.
